NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

Investigations involving the removal and replacement of six limestone portico steps to establish the location and extents of any voids below. One step on the east side of the portico will be removed, cleaned, re-bedded and re-pointed as an example of the potential refurbishment of the retained stone steps. A petrographic examination of a sample will be carried out to establish the stone composition for replacement stone sourcing. Stone cleaning trials, using the DOFF system, will be carried out on the rear faces of two portico columns and within a recess on the east side of the building.
